 To appease the Jews in the region of Derbe, Lystra and Iconium, Paul allowed Timothy, whose mother was a Jewess to be circumcised (1-3) 	
 The decree from Jerusalem was given to the churches, strengthening their faith (4-5) 	
The Macedonian Call (6-10)	
 Paul and company traveled through Phrygia and the region of Galatia (6) 	
 The Holy Spirit denied them to preach in Asia or Bithynia (7-8) 	
 Instead, Paul experience a vision, and was led to Macedonia (9-10) 	
The Conversion of Lydia (11-15)	
 In Philippi, Paul preached to the women by the river on the Sabbath day (11-13) 	
 Lydia and her house obeyed the gospel, and constrained Paul and his party to stay with her (14-15) 	
The Conversion of the Jailor (16-34)	
 Paul and Silas were beaten with rods and thrown into prison for casting out a spirit of divination from a slave girl, whose masters profited from her possession (16- 24) 	
 An earthquake released them, and Paul assured the Jailor that all the prisoners remained (25-28) 	
• The Jailor and his household responded to the gospel and were saved (29-34)	
Paul Released from Prison (35-40)	
 Paul appealed to his citizenship as a Roman, and gained apologies and a release from imprisonment (35-39) 	
 Paul and his party went to Lydia's house to encourage the brethren, then left Philippi (40)
