Time Frame of Chapter 8	Student Notes:
 Acts 8 begins a new section of the book. The dispersion of Christians as persecution intensifies. 	
 These events follow immediately the death of Stephen. 	
 Again, sometime near the conversion of Saul (Acts 9), which has been placed at 34 A.D. 	
Saul the Persecutor (1-3)	
 Persecution against the church led to a dispersion of Christians throughout Judea and Samaria (1) 	
 Saul was a preeminent persecutor of the early church (2) cf. Galatians 1:13-14 	
Christ is Preached in Samaria (4-25)	
• Philip preached and performed miracles (4-8)	
 Simon the Sorcerer, and others in Samaria, were converted to Christ (9-13) 	
 Peter and John went to Samaria to lay hands on the people, that they might receive the Holy Spirit (14-17) 	
• Simon sinned, and Peter admonished him (18-25)	
Christ is Preached to the Eunuch (26-40)	
 Holy Spirit led Philip to the Eunuch to preach to him (26-28) 	
 Philip converses with the Eunuch, and preaches Jesus unto him (29-35) 	
The Eunuch requests baptism (36)	
 Philip establishes the prerequisites to baptism: belief and confession (37) 	
 Philip immerses the Eunuch in water, which leads to rejoicing on the part of the Eunuch (38-39) 	
• Philip is caught away by the Spirit to Azotus (39-40)
